

# Sustainable Wood Checklist

**1. What type of trees are at the sight:**

Box:  
The bark breaks into small pieces.



Stringy Bark:  
Peels off in long strips.



Gum:  
Smooth bark:  
Some gums are good eg red gum but white gum not very good.



Angophra:  
Stringy bark and crooked branches. Not very good wood for burning.



**2. Count out 20 meters square:**

Measure any wood laying on the ground that is greater than 10 cm in diameter (line below is 10 cm)

**3. Write down the measurements:**

Total of Measurements

Convert to per Hectare measurement by multiplying by 25

**4. Compare to Benchmark for that type of Wood type**

- Gum
  - Stringybark
  - Box
  - Iron bark
5. You can take the amount that is greater than the benchmark:  
eg If you have calculated 940 meters of stringbark per hectare then you can take 260 meters of wood from the ground without impacting the biodiversity of the area.
